**CATHOLIC FAITH 101**

The LITURGICAL YEAR serves as the Catholic liturgical calendar. It consists of the cycle of liturgical seasons that determine when feast days and other holy days are observed, and which Scripture and Gospel readings are used at Mass. Aside from the readings, the liturgical calendar also determines the interior decoration of a Church/Chapel, the priest's vestment colors, the timing of spiritual seasons and practices. The liturgical year is made up of six seasons:

**Advent** – (blue purple) four weeks of preparation before the celebration of Jesus' birth and beginning of the new year

**Christmas** – (white) recalling the Nativity of Jesus Christ and his manifestation to the peoples of the world

**Lent** – (red purple) a six-week period of penance before Easter, commencing on Ash Wednesday

**Sacred Paschal Triduum** – (white) the holiest "Three Days" of the Church's year, where the Christian people recall the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus: Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil/Sunday

**Easter** – (white) 50 days of joyful celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead and his sending forth of the Holy Spirit

**Ordinary Time** – (green) divided into two sections (one span of 4-8 weeks after Christmas Time and another lasting about six months after Easter Time), wherein the faithful consider the fullness of Jesus' teachings and works among his people
